Institutional Best Practices

1. Title Of the Practice – Gender Sensitization and Women empowerment (First Best Practice)

2. The Context

Women empowerment is an important goal for achieving sustainable development. Girls have limited access to education, power, job opportunities, economic resources as compared to boys. Girls' health problems are prominent due to low levels of hemoglobin, lack of knowledge towards health & hygiene and malnutrition. Frequent news of rapes in the country, making the girls and their parents hesitant to take higher education. Girls need to be aware of their rights, gender discrimination and sexual harassment. Moreover, the boys should be aware of responsible behaviour without making any discrimination with girls.

3. Objectives

- To bring the girls in the vicinity into main stream of education.
- To implement various activities for the empowerment of girl students and improved health of girls.
- To create a safe environment for girls.
- To inform girl students about the laws for women safety and their legal rights.
- To conduct sessions on adolescent sexual health awareness.

4. The Practice

The Institution in consistently taking efforts to bring the girls in the vicinity into main stream of education. Due to economically weaker conditions, many girls leave the schooling after Higher Secondary education. The college staff always convince the girls whose families cannot afford higher education and make them to take admission, even at cost of out of own pocket.

Our college always focused on safe campus environment for girls. Women development cell and the staff has succeeded in creating a safe environment.

The Women Development Cell in the college is very active. Newly admitted female students in the college are informed about grievance procedure details and asked to

immediately inform the women's grievance redressal cell in case of any problem. The women development cell of the college is continuously implementing various activities for the empowerment of girl students and improved health of girls.

A monthly wall paper is published by the Women Development Cell. The boys and girls choose different articles related to gender sensitization and post them on wall paper under guidance of WDC.

Our faculty Mrs. Sumedha Naik conducted slide show presentation and interactive session on adolescent sexual health and aids awareness.

About 100 girl students participated in "Jagar Janivancha Abhiyan" a competition organized. Suggestion to create gender awareness were taken from the students through a structured questionnaire. All the suggestions were collected, analyzed and summarized by WDC convenor and sent to the Government of Maharashtra. Government authorities much appreciated this initiative.

Innovative program "Gender sensitization through games" *Khel Mandiyela* was organized by Women Development cell. Janiv Jatruti Kruti Divas was celebrated by Women Development Cell on 23rd January 2013. Guidance session was organized with Dr. Shilpa Zantye on women health. Domestic Violence Act Guidance was done by Adv. Sudarshan Girsagar.

5. Obstacles Faced (Problems)

- Hesitation to express the gender issues.
- · Orthodox family background of students.
- · Number of women staff in the institute is lesser.
- Special cabin for discussing the female issues.
- Due to economically weaker conditions, malnutrition of girls and the longer travel time are the major obstacles in improving health conditions.

6. Strategy to overcome

- Female students were motivated to express their opinions through interactive sessions.
- Regular follow-up with parents about the health problems of girls.
- Developing leadership qualities among girl student through participation in organization of various activities of WDC.

7. Impact (Evidence Of Success)

- To date, not a single complaint of sexual harassment or ragging has been received by the women's grievance redressal Cell.
- Every year the number of girls admitted in college is increasing more than the number of boys.
- In Collaboration with Br. Nath Pai Sevangan WDC conducted anti-rape Campaign and publication of Handbook of questions related to rapes.
- The WDC bagged Government of Maharashtra 2ndPrize at District Level in "Jagar Janivancha Abhiyan" of Rs 50,000 in 2012-2013.

Title of the Practice – Asmita – Annual Publication of the College (Second Best Practice)

2. The Context

For holistic development of students, they should extend their reading and writing beyond their studies and express their views with assertion. Students need to opine on political, social, economic and educational issues in the society. To give scope for writing abilities in the students, the college publishes its own yearly periodical "ASMITA". Any student and staff can write articles, stories, poems and his views on current situation. At the same time, it mirrors the college activities through annual reports of various

departments and individual performance highlights of the faculties. In short, 'ASMITA" is the scripted replica of our college.

3. Objectives

- To motivate students to read and write and use their writing, drafting, proof reading skills.
- To motivate students to express their views and opinions.
- To save information of different activities, events, programs and data in the form of annual publication.
- To showcase the individual performance of staff.

4. The Practice

College has been publishing its annual publication "ASMITA" since 1965 with very few exceptional years. Every Year, the Editorial Committee is formed to take the

responsibility from collection, revision, proof reading, publication and distribution of ASMITA. The committee includes faculties and students. College Principal is the publisher of the publication. ASMITA provides the institutional information of Governing Body, Local Management Committee, teaching & non-teaching Staff. It is an artistic collage of photos of all events conducted in college including the annual gathering and cultural programmes.

The literature section is divided in Marathi, English and Hindi. NCC, NSS, WDC, Gymkhana, DLLE and other departments give their detailed reports and achievements during the year.

At the end individual reports of staff about their responsibilities, achievements, extension activities, research and publications; information of annual prize winners; statistical data of current year regarding student examinations, results and enrollment are given.

After proof reading and necessary changes the final copy is printed. ASMITA is published
in special ceremony by special guests.

5. Obstacles Faced (Problems)

- Many students hesitate to write in ASMITA.
- The Editorial Committee has to take consistent efforts for collection of articles from students.
- Due to limited printing technology advancements in Malvan, it sometimes takes time for publication.
- The cost of publication is very high.

6. Strategy to overcome

- Editorial committee plans to increase participation of more students through timely notices, personal talk with students and appeals in classes.
